

What is the Equity Fund?

The Equity Fund is a US\$4.5M fund created by the Wikimedia Foundation to support external organizations whose work increases the availability of free knowledge by counteracting structural inequalities relating to racial equity around the world.

- Knowledge equity is core to our movement and strategic direction.
- Barriers to knowledge equity may be rooted in systems of racial oppression
- Focused fund to invest in orgs that address racial bias and inequality

Fund Scope

- Grantees who advance free knowledge and racial equity
- Inspired by US events, but global focus befitting the movement's footprint
- **Theory of change:** grantees with clear methodologies for impact, rather than requiring them to conform to the committee's metrics
- "No start ups": established organizations with track records of impact
- **Sustainability:** grantees should have a financial model that does not depend solely on a pilot grant program
- Grantee selection process still evolving
