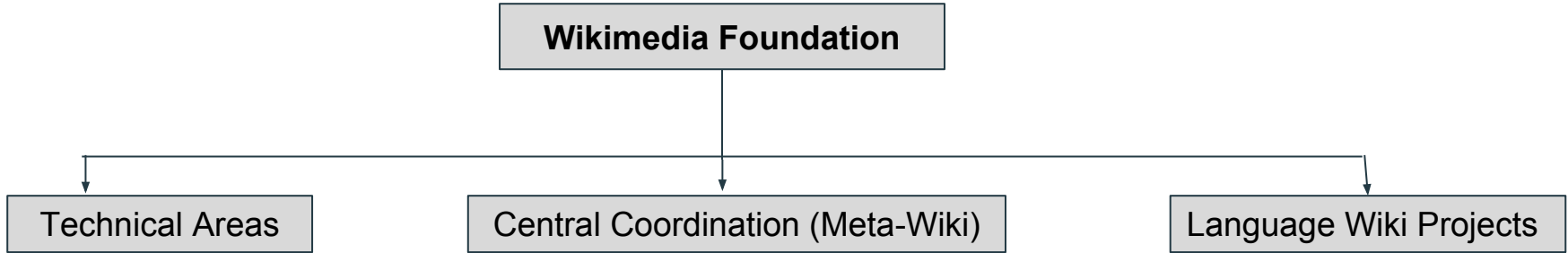

Wikimedia World

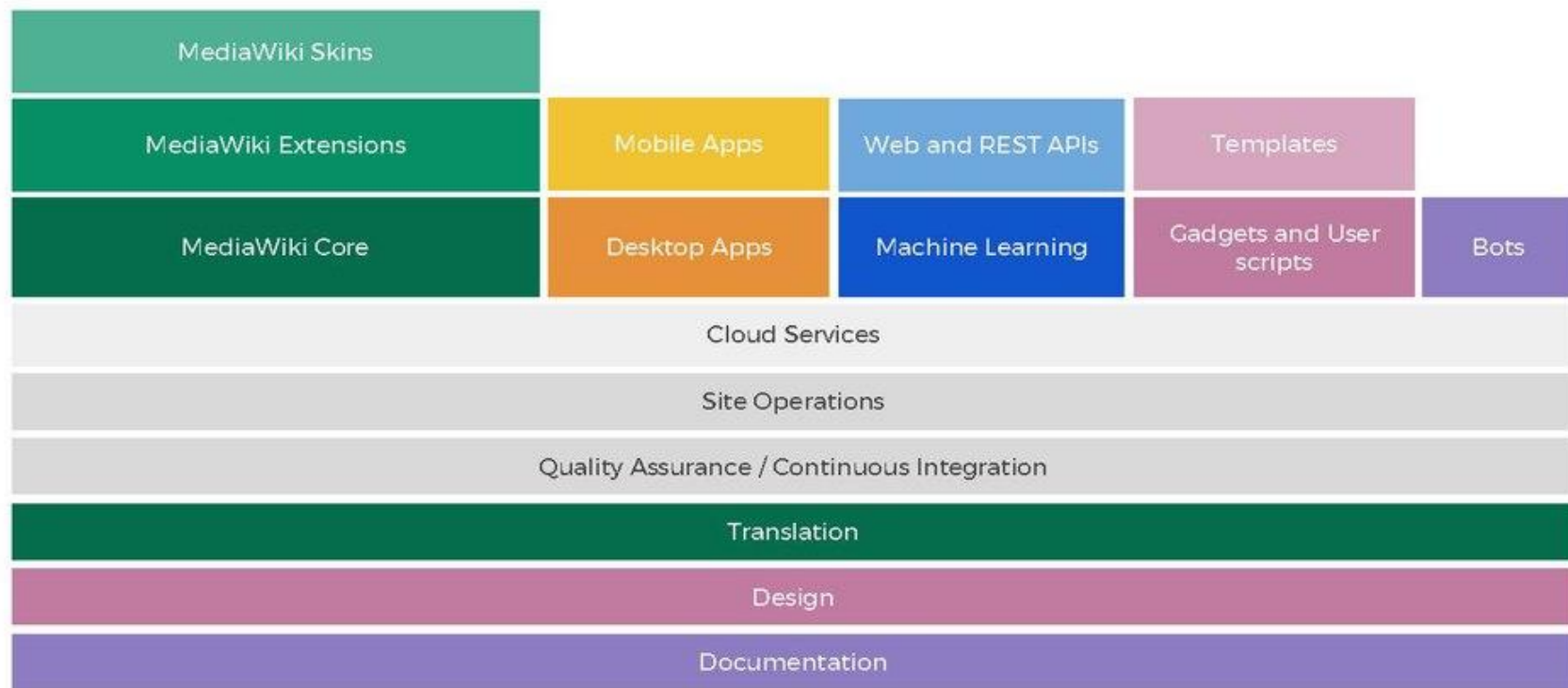


Technical Areas:- In this area, You will get all technical work of wikimedia world. It have many technical areas like MediaWiki, Bot, UserScripts, Tools etc

Central Coordination Wiki:- It is also known as Meta-Wiki. Meta-Wiki is the global community site for the Wikimedia Foundation's projects and related projects, from coordination and documentation to planning and analysis.

Language Wiki Projects:- This is a free open wiki for language projects, Anyone can view and edit their content. The shining example of this is English Wikipedia.

SUL Vs Wikimedia Developer Account

SUL stands for Single user login, It is also called Global Account. It means if you want to edit Wikimedia language Project including metawiki, mediawiki.org. Then you only need to create one account. And you can login at any wikimedia wiki projects by this global account.

But Wikimedia developer account is different from SUL. If you want to contribute in Technical Areas then you will need to create a separate account from SUL for Technical Contribution. The main reasons of wikimedia developer account is because we need to manage SSH key etc.

Lets Create wikimedia developer account

1. Create SUL account at any Wiki (If you did not create yet)
2. Goto <https://toolsadmin.wikimedia.org/register/>
3. Login with your Wikimedia account
4. Choose your developer account username
5. Choose your UNIX shell username
6. Add your email address
7. Set your password
8. Click on Create account

You can create developer account on Wikitech just like SUL.

Now after creating a developer account. Create account on phabricator. And now you can link your all account on <https://toolsadmin.wikimedia.org/profile/settings/accounts>

Intro to Phabricator

Phabricator is an open-source software development platform. In Wikimedia, many projects use Phabricator for project management, software bug reporting and feature requests.

MediaWiki is a free server-based software, licensed under the GNU General Public License (GPL). It's designed to run on a large server farm for a website that gets millions of hits per day.


MediaWiki is an extremely powerful, scalable software and a feature-rich wiki implementation that uses PHP to process and display data stored in a database, such as MySQL.

Pages use MediaWiki's wikitext format, so that users without knowledge of HTML or CSS can edit them easily.

1. **MediaWiki is wiki software.**
2. **MediaWiki is server software.**
3. **MediaWiki is geared towards the needs of the Wikimedia projects.**
4. **MediaWiki is free software.**
